The Cecelia Dunlap Grand Chapter Questionnaire was developed to provide a platform for the members of this Order to voice their opinions, concerns, likes and dislikes regarding this Order; and to solicit suggestions for improvement.

The questionnaire was sent to every Worthy Matron in the jurisdiction requesting that they see that every member of their chapter received a questionnaire. The questionnaire was also posted on the Grand Lodge website for members to be able to download it.

When creating this document it was my hope that it would serve as a means of creating a dialog between the Subordinate Chapter Worthy Matrons, the District Deputy Grand Matrons and your elected Grand Chapter Officers to address your concerns as well as to consider your suggestions for improving this great Order, increasing membership and making every members voice a part of this discussion.

My goal of this report is to simply report what it is that you the members have said and allow your words to be a starting point for moving our Order forward.

Of the approximately 700 members in the Jurisdiction I have received responses from 44 members representing each of the five districts.

Far Western	<u>Respondents</u> – 12 <u>Attendance</u> – 0-10% (1); 20-40% (2); 50-70% (1); 75-100% (8) <u>Chapter Attendance average</u> – 35%. Respondents considered attendance fair <u>Reasons for attendance</u> : disinterest, Health, Night driving, work. Dedicated members show up <u>Ritualistic Opening</u> : 100% (10); 75% (1); 0% (1) <u>Charity</u> : 11 of 12 stated they participate in charitable endeavors <u>District Meetings</u> : 9 stated they attend, 1 when they can, 1 no, not a good time, 1 no, because Matron doesn't.
Western	<u>Respondents</u> – 16 <u>Attendance</u> – 50-70% (2); 75-100% (14) <u>Chapter Attendance average</u> – 50%. Respondents considered attendance good <u>Reasons for attendance</u> : any excuse to cancel, attendees consist of Past Matrons, feelings get in the way and people stop coming. <u>Ritualistic Opening</u> : 100% (10); 80-90% (5); 70% (1) <u>Charity</u> : 16 of 16 stated they participate in charitable endeavors <u>District Meetings</u> : 15 stated they attend, 1 no, due to work.
Eastern	<u>Respondents</u> – 3 <u>Attendance</u> – 75-100% (3) <u>Chapter Attendance average</u> – 39%. Respondents considered attendance good <u>Reasons for attendance</u> : no response <u>Ritualistic Opening</u> : 100% (3) <u>Charity</u> : 3 of 3 stated they participate in charitable endeavors <u>District Meetings</u> : 3 stated they attend
Central	Respondents – 4 <u>Attendance</u> – 75-100% (4) <u>Chapter Attendance average</u> – 28%. Respondents considered attendance poor <u>Reasons for attendance</u> : feel they don't belong, waste of time, nothing gets accomplished, lack of support for fundraisers, too many side conversations, Secretary and treasurer don't attend, too negative <u>Ritualistic Opening</u> : 100% (3) <u>Charity</u> : 4 of 4 stated they participate in charitable endeavors <u>District Meetings</u> : 4 stated they attend
SouthCentral	<u>Respondents</u> – 9 <u>Attendance</u> – 75-100% (6); 50-70% (3) <u>Chapter Attendance average</u> – 43%. Respondents considered attendance poor <u>Reasons for attendance</u> : Church, Bible study, Apathy, Not highest priority, don't want to work with new members <u>Ritualistic Opening</u> : 10% (8)

<u>Charity:</u> 8 of 9 stated they participate in charitable endeavors <u>District Meetings</u>: 3 stated they attend, 6 stated they do not attend

Reasons cited for not attending District Meetings across all districts was work, transportation and disinterest.

The remainder of this report will consist of responses given to the remaining questions contained in the questionnaire.

Member opinions/suggestions:

- 1. What is your opinion of District meetings? (i.e. what do you like, dislike, would like to see, etc.).
 - Respondents overwhelming said they liked the fellowship with other chapters and meeting new sisters and brothers.
 - Teach different things at each district, not same stuff
 - Combine districts with 5 or less chapters.
 - Would like to see more workshops. More demonstrations, less lectures.
 - Need to be on the same page, statewide.

2. What is your opinion of Grand Session? (i.e. what do you like, dislike, would like to see, etc.).

- Respondents overwhelming said they liked the fellowship, seeing other chapter members.
- Officers of CDGC and subordinate chapters need to remember our mission. It is beginning to be all about titles and dress rather than who we are and what our landmarks are.
- Good experience, especially for new members.
- Need broader participation on committees.
- OVERRATED! We can get all our business done in one day. Need to look at better solution.

- Need better communication and organization.
- We need to be doing things the same way.
- Don't play favorites.
- Eliminate the self-importance, jealousy, title seeking in both local chapters and GC.
- Stop allowing members to become matrons within a year or two after joining. They can't lead if they don't know what's going on.
- Promote unity, stop negativity.
- Make time to do things together, ie, movies, dinner, etc., with the chapter and lodge.
- Announce new members, possibly on List Serve.
- The demands can be a hardship, with district mtgs, grand session, MWRC, Conference of Grand Matrons, etc., with transportation, rooms, meals, registration fees. If we're not careful we may price ourselves out of existence.

It is my sincere hope that this document will serve as a catalyst for discussion within the subordinate chapters as well as the Grand Chapter.
